Notes forming part of the Financial Statements for the year ended March 31, 2021

1. Company Overview

Suninfra Energies Private Limited ("the Company") is a private company domiciled in India. The Company is in the business of providing solar energy solution services. The Company provides integrated solar energy services as alternate power solutions for residential and commercial use.

2. Significant accounting policies

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to the periods presented in these financial statements.

2.1 Basis of preparation of Financial Statement

These financial statements are prepared in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) under the historical cost convention on the accrual basis GAAP comprises mandatory accounting standards as prescribed under Section133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('the Act') read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014, the provisions of the Act (to the extent notified) and guidelines issued by the Securities and ExchangeBoard of India (SEBI). Accounting policies have been consistently applied except where a newly issuedaccounting standard is initially adopted or are vision to an existing accounting standard requires a changein the accounting policy hitherto in use. The financial statements are presented in Indian rupees rounded off to the nearest lakhs.

2.2 Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires the management of the Company to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported balances of assets and liabilities and disclosures relating to the contingent liabilities as at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of income and expenditure during the period. Differences between actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known / materialized.

2.3 Current and Non-current Classification

All assets and liabilities are classified as current and non-current

Assets:

An asset is classified as current when it satisfies any of the following criteria:

- a) It is expected to be realised in or is intended for sale or consumption in the Company's normal operating cycle;
- b) It is held primarily for the purpose of being traded;
- c) It is expected to be realized within 12 months after the reporting date; or
- d) it is cash or cash equivalent unless it is restricted from being exchanged or used to settle aliability for at least 12 months after the reporting date.

Current assets include the current portion of non-current financial assets. All other assets are classified as non-current.

Liabilities:

A liability is classified as current when it satisfies any of the following criteria:

- a) It is expected to be settled in the Company's normal operating cycle;
- b) It is held primarily for the purpose of being traded;
- c) It is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting date; or

d) The Company does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least12 months after the reporting date. Terms of a liability that could, at the option of the counterparty, resultin its settlement by the issue of equity instruments do not affect its classification.

Current liabilities include current portion of non-current financial liabilities. All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

2.4 Inventories

Inventories which comprise raw materials, finished goods, stock-in-trade and stores and spares arecarried at the lower of cost and net realizable value.

Cost of inventories comprises of all cost of purchase including duties and taxes other than thosesubsequently recovered by the enterprise from the tax authorities, freight inward, cost of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition.

Cost is determined on the basis of Weighted Average Cost method. Netrealizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the estimated costof completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

Raw materials and other supplies held for use in the production of finished products are not written downbelow cost except in cases where material prices have declined and it is estimated that the cost of finished products will exceed their net realizable value.

The comparison of cost and net realizable value is made on an item-by-item basis.

Consumables stores are charged to the Statement of profit and loss at the point of purchase.

Stock of scrap and waste is valued at estimated realizable value. Machinery spares that are of regular use are charged to Statement of Profit and Loss as and when consumed.

2.5 Operating cycle

Operating cycle is the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realization incash or cash equivalents.

Revenue recognition: Sale of goods

Revenue from sale of goods in the course of ordinary activities is recognized when property in goods or all significant risks and rewards of their ownership are transferred to the customers and no significantuncertainty exist regarding the amount of the consideration that will be derived from the sale of the goodsand regarding its collection. The amount recognized as revenue is exclusive of duties, taxes and is net of returns and discounts.

2.6 Impairment

The carrying amounts of the Company's assets are reviewed at each reporting date in accordance with Accounting Standard-28 'Impairment of assets' to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated as higher of its net selling price and value in use. An impairment loss is recognized whenever the carrying amount of an asset or its cash generating unit exceeds its recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss. An impairment loss is reversed if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount. An impairment loss is reversed only to the extent

that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined net of depreciation or amortization, had no impairment loss been recognized.

2.7 Taxation

Tax expense comprises of current and deferred tax.

(a) Income Tax Provision

Tax expense comprises of current tax and deferred tax. Current tax is measured at the amount expected to be paid to/recovered from the tax authorities, based on estimated tax liability computed after taking credit for allowances and exemption in accordance with Income Tax Act 1961 and rules thereunder.

(b) Deferred Tax Provision

Deferred tax is recognised on timing differences, being the differences between the taxable income and the accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are recognised for all timing differences. Deferred tax assets are recognised for timing differences of items other than unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward losses only to the extent that reasonable certainty exists that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which these can be realised. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if such items relate to taxes on income levied by the same governing tax laws and the Company has a legally enforceable right for such set off. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date for their realisability.

2.8 Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders by the number of equity shares outstanding at the end of the year. For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, net profit or loss for the year attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year are adjusted for the effect of all dilutive potential equity shares except where the results would be anti-dilutive.

2.9 Provisions and contingencies

The Company recognizes a provision when there is a present obligation as a result of a past event that probably requires an outflow of resources and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. A disclosure for a contingent liability is made when there is a possible but not probable obligation or a present obligation that may, but probably will not, entail an outflow of resources. When there is an obligation in respect of which the likelihood of outflow of resources is remote, no provision or disclosure is made.

2.10 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank, cash in hand and fixed deposits with banks with an original maturity of three months or less.
