1. Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Team Lease Skills University ('The University"), which comprises of the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2023, Income and Expenditure Account and the Cash flow statement for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information. In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the University as at March 31, 2023, the excess of income over expenditure and cash flows of the University for the year then ended in accordance with the Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI).

2. Basis for Opinion

Our opinion on the financial Statements and our report on Other Requirements below is not modified in respect of these matter.

4. Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the aforesaid Accounting Standards, and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

- 1. Significant Accounting Policies and Notes to Financial Statements
- A. Background of the University:
- 1. Team Lease Skills University (the "University") is India's first vocational university established as a Private University under the provisions of the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009 as notified in the Gujarat Government Gazette dated April 22, 2013. Team Lease Education Foundation (TLEF) (not for profit company registered u/s 8 of the companies Act,2013), which is a 100% subsidiary of Team Lease Services Limited (TSL), is the sponsoring body of the University.
- The main objective of the University is to contribute to workforce productivity, socio-economic development and social harmony through well rounded and industry relevant educational and training programs with low-cost delivery methodology. And also enable all individuals acquire skills and capabilities, prepare them to get appropriate employment and ensure their competitiveness in national and international work environment.
- 3. The University promotes an apprenticeship programme called National Employability through Apprenticeship Programme (NETAP), which is governed under National Employability Enhancement Mission (NEEM) 2013 Scheme, which is notified vide notification no. F.No.37-3/Legal/AICTE/2013 issued by Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India. The main objective of the said notification is to enhance employability of the graduate/ diploma holders or students pursuing graduation/ diploma to pursue an on-the-job training programme.
- 4. On Dec 23, 2022, Department of Higher Education vide notification number F.No.36-27/2018.NVEQF has discontinued National Employability Enhancement Mission Scheme (NEEM), which was major activity being carried out by the university.
- The University is also pursuing with the Government of India permission to accord academic credit for the students pursuing the NETAP programme whereby the students would be entitled to a predetermined academic credit for the period of on-the-job-training undergone by the said students. The said programme, National Apprenticeship Linked Skill Oriented Courses or NALSOC, is yet to be approved by the Government.
- 6. The University has added a new program called Work Integrated Learning Programs (WILP) in the current year. These are courses designed to enable professionals to pursue higher education while continuing their job, addressing the growing demand for such bridge-programs. Made to address the evolving needs of industries, future ready organizations are creating a smarter workforce by investing in WILP programs to upskill their existing workforce and enhance their productivity.





6. The University has also added a new scheme called National Apprenticeship Training Scheme (NATS) in the current financial year. The University got the approval for empanelment as a TPA (Third Party Aggregator) with the Board of Apprenticeship Training (Western Region) [BOAT (WR)], Mumbai for implementation of NATS scheme vide letter reference number BOAT WR/TPA/2023/8659 dated Jan 24, 2023. The objectives of the scheme are to promote skill development and to bridge the gaps in providing the skill the students do not acquire during their study in colleges and thus make them more employable. Another objective is to facilitate the employers to train disciplined and skilled manpower to meet the required human resources in the emerging areas like Production Linked Incentive Scheme and PM Gatishakti National Master Plan.

B. Significant Accounting Policies:

1. Basis for Preparation of Accounts

The Financial statements are prepared in accordance with the Indian Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) under the historical cost convention, and on the accrual method of accounting and Accounting Standards as issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

2. Use of Estimates

The preparation of Financial Statements requires the management to make the estimates and assumptions considered on the reported amount of assets and liabilities as on the date of financial statements and the reported income and expenditure during the reporting period. Management believes that the estimates used in the preparation of financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Actual result could differ from the estimates. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known or materialize.

3. Income Recognition

- (i) Fees collected from students is recognised on accrual basis and accounted for on the basis of period of Academic year.
- (ii) Income from Enterprise Learning Services and National Employability through Apprenticeship Programme is recognised on Accrual Basis.
- (iii) Interest income on deposits is recognized on a time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and the rate applicable.





4. Property, Plant & Equipment:

- (i) All Property, Plant & Equipment are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment loss, if any. Cost comprises the purchase price and all incidental costs related to acquisition and bringing the asset to its working condition for its intended use.
- (ii) Depreciation on tangible assets is provided on Straight Line Method at the rates mentioned hereunder. Depreciation for assets purchased / sold during a year is proportionately charged.

5. Intangible Assets and Amortisation:

- (i) An intangible asset is recognised, only where it is probable that future economic benefits attributable to the asset will accrue to the enterprise and the cost can be measured reliably. Intangibles are stated at cost, less accumulated amortization and impairment losses, if any. Expenditure on acquisition of software has been separated from computers and peripherals, as apart from being intangible assets.
- (ii) The software cost is amortised @ 40 % on straight line method basis.
- (iii) Goodwill is tested against impairment at the end of each financial year.

6. Impairment of Assets:

The carrying amounts of assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal/external factors. On such indication, the recoverable amount of the assets is estimated and if such estimation is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the asset's net selling price and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and risks specific to the asset.

7. Grants

Grants received for the projects, and which is required to be refunded if remains unutilized is included under the head Liabilities i.e. amount received to be utilized for specific purpose in Balance Sheet. Expenditure incurred on related projects is reduced from the balance of the said grant.





8. Earmarked/Endowment Funds

The long terms funds for specific purposes are included in Earmarked Fund. Each of the fund is invested in separate bank account / investments. The income from such investments are credited to the respective fund. The expenditure incurred out of these fund are debited to the respective fund account. The assets created out of Earmarked Funds where the ownership vests in the Institution, are merged with the assets of the Institution. An amount equal to the value of asset is credited to Capital Fund.

9. Employee Benefits:

(i) Defined Contribution Plan:

Employee benefits in the form of Provident Fund is defined contribution scheme and the contributions are charged to the Income & Expenditure Account of the year when the contributions to the respective funds are due.

(ii) Defined benefit Plan:

Gratuity and Leave Encashment liability for eligible employees is defined benefit obligation and are provided for on the basis of an actuarial valuation on projected unit credit method made at the end of each financial year. Obligation is measured at the present value of estimated future cash flows using discounted rate that is determined by reference to market yields at the Balance Sheet date on Government Securities where the currency and terms of the Government Securities are consistent with the currency and estimated terms of the defined benefit obligation. Actuarial gains/losses are immediately taken to Statement of Profit and Loss.

10. Lease

Lease payments under operating leases are recognised as an expense on accrual basis in statement of profit and loss over lease term.

- 11. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets:
 - (i) A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past event; it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.



(ii) Contingent Liabilities are not recognized but are disclosed in the notes. Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.

12. Stale Cheques

Stale cheques are accounted on quarterly basis Bank reconciliation. Stale cheque amounts are written back to revenue account based on ageing (greater than 3 years). While writing back only inactive client ID related stale cheques are written back which are greater than 3 years and for active client ID stale cheques, will be written back after 7 years.

13. General

All other accounting policies not specifically mentioned herewith above are consistent with generally accepted accounting practices.

In respect of Endowment Fund of University:

TeamLease Skills University (TLSU) is required to deposit Rs. 3.00 crores with Gujarat State Financial Services Limited (GSFS) towards Endowment Fund in terms of Letter of Intent no. GPU/2011/126/Kh-1 dated 07.02.2012 issued under section 9 of Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009. As specified in section 36 of the Gujarat Private Universities Act, 2009, the Endowment Fund is non-transferrable and the said fund will remain with GSFS till the university survives as well as the Interest received on Endowment Fund will be utilized for the development of infrastructure of the University.

- In terms of LOI dated 7th February, 2012, the financing of the University is the responsibility of the sponsoring body. Accordingly, the sponsoring body and the ultimate holding company of the sponsoring body continue to provide financial support as and when required by the University to fund deficit, if any. In view of the same, financial statements of the university are prepared on going concern basis.
- On Dec 23, 2022, Department of Higher Education vide notification number F.No.36-27/2018.NVEQF has discontinued National Employability Enhancement Mission Scheme (NEEM), which was major activity being carried out by the university. Further, the university has identified and carried out activities under a new program called Work Integrated Learning Programs (WILP) and National Apprenticeship Training Scheme (NATS) from current
- As per amended provisions of Income tax Act, 1961 the University has opted exemption u/s 12A(1)(ac)(i) of Income tax Act, 1961. Further, the University is no longer eligible for the exemption u/s 10(23C)(vi) of the Income tax Act, 1961. The Trust is registered under unique registration No. AAAJT2549PE20150 dt 24.9.2021 for the Assessment Year 2022-2023 to 2026-2027 subject to fulfilment of certain conditions.
- In view of the exemptions available to the University under the Income Tax Act, 1961, no provision for Income Tax is made in the accounts.
- The sponsoring body had vide resolution dated April 20, 2023 waived of loan amounting into Rs. 9,80,00,000 /- which has been recorded as income by the university in Income and Expenditure Account for the year ended March 31, 2023.
- These financial statements have been prepared in the format suggested by the Central Higher Educational Institution, issued by Ministry of Human Resource and Development, Government of India.
- Previous year figures have been regrouped, re-arranged and reclassified wherever necessary to conform to the Current Year's Classification.
