#### Note # 1 Significant Accounting Policies | Financial Year 2021-22

#### 1. General Information: Background

The company is engaged in the business of Engineering Design and IT/IT enabled Services.

# 2. Basis of accounting and preparation of financial statements:

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2021 and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act"), as applicable. The financial statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention.

#### 3. Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the Indian GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) as of the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses for the reporting period. The estimates and assumptions used in the accompanying financial statements are based upon management's evaluation of the relevant facts and circumstances as of the date of financial statements. Actual results could differ from these estimates. Any revisions to accounting estimates are recognized prospectively in the current and future periods.

#### 4. Inventories

Company has physical goods in stock. Inventories include Computer hardware and networking materials and closing work in progress of different projects i.e., unbilled activities determined according to the extent of completion of projects.

# 5. Cash Flow Statement

Cash flows are reported using the indirect method, whereby profit / (loss) before extraordinary items and tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non-cash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated based on the available information.

#### 6. Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, Plant and Equipment are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation / amortization and impairment losses, if any. Costs include purchase price net of any trade discounts and rebates, any import duties and other taxes (other than those subsequently recoverable from the tax authorities), any directly attributable expenditure on making the asset ready for its intended use, other incidental expenses and interest on borrowings attributable to acquisition of qualifying fixed assets up to the date the asset is ready for its intended use. Subsequent expenditure related to an item of fixed asset is capitalized only if such expenditure increases the future benefits from existing asset beyond its previously assessed standard of performance. All other expenses on existing property, plant and equipment, including day-to-day repair and maintenance expenditure and cost of replacing parts are charged to the statement of profit and loss for the period during which such expenses are incurred. Depreciation on tangible fixed assets has been provided on the written down value method as per the useful life prescribed in Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013 except in respect of the few categories of assets, in whose case the life of the assets has been assessed as under based on technical advice, taking into account the nature of the asset, the estimated usage of the asset, the operating conditions

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of the asset, past history of replacement, anticipated technological changes, manufacturers warranties and maintenance support, etc. Please refer Note # 24 for more details

#### 7. Intangible assets And Amortization

Acquired capital software licenses are capitalized on the basis of cost incurred to acquire and install the specific software. These assets are amortized over the estimated useful lives on straight line basis, commencing from the date the asset is available to the Company for its use.

After initial recognition, intangible assets are carried at its cost less any accumulated amortization and any accumulated impairment losses

#### 8. Revenue Recognition

#### a. Income from rendering Services

Revenues from contracts priced on a time and material basis are recognised when services are rendered and related costs are incurred. Revenues from turnkey contracts, which are generally time bound fixed price contracts, are recognised over the life of the contract using the proportionate completion method, with contract costs determining the degree of completion. Foreseeable losses on such contracts are recognised when probable.

### b. Unbilled Revenue

Unbilled Revenue included in Other Current Assets represent revenues recognised on services rendered to the extent of completion of projects, for which amounts are to be billed in subsequent periods

#### c. Income from Sale of Goods

Revenues from sale of goods are recognised when ownership of goods is transferred to the buyer for a price, all significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to buyer, seller does not retain any effective control of ownership of the transferred goods and when there is no significant uncertainty in collection of the amount of consideration

#### 9. Other Income

Interest income is accounted on accrual basis. Dividend income is accounted for when the right to receive it is established.

# 10. Investments

Long-term investments (excluding investment properties) are carried individually at cost less provision for diminution, other than temporary, in the value of such investments. Current investments are carried individually, at the lower of cost and fair value. Cost of investments includes acquisition charges such as brokerage, fees and duties.

#### 11. Employee Benefits

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Employee benefits include provident fund, employee state insurance scheme, gratuity fund, compensated absences.

#### **Defined Contribution Plans**

The Company's contribution to provident fund, superannuation fund and employee state insurance scheme are considered as defined contribution plans and are charged as an expense based on the amount of contribution required to be made and when services are rendered by the employees.

#### Gratuity

Gratuity is a post-employment benefit and is in the nature of defined benefit plan.

The Gratuity is funded by way of contribution to Gratuity Fund Account maintained with the third party. Hence there is no liability provided in the books of account.

The defined benefit/obligation is calculated at the balance sheet date by an independent Actuary. The actuarial gains or losses are recognized immediately in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

#### Leave encashment

Leave encashment is in the nature of defined benefit plan. The liability recognized in the balance sheet in respect of Leave Encashment is the present value of the defined benefit obligation as at the balance sheet date.

The defined benefit/obligation is calculated at the balance sheet date by an independent Actuary. The actuarial gains or losses are recognized immediately in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

# 12. Foreign Currency Transaction

#### a. Initial Recognition

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency (Indian rupees), by way of applying the conversion rate prevailing on the date of transaction, to the foreign currency amount.

#### b. Conversion Foreign currency

Monetary items are re-valued using the conversion rate prevailing at the reporting date. Monetary items which are measured at fair value or other similar valuation denominated in a foreign currency are reported using the exchange rate that existed when the value was determined.

# c. Exchange Differences

Exchange differences arising on the settlement of monetary items or on reporting Company's monetary items at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year are recognized as income or expense in the year in which they arise

### 13. Borrowings Costs

Borrowing costs include interest, amortization of ancillary costs incurred and exchange differences arising from foreign currency borrowings to the extent they are regarded as an adjustment to the interest cost. Costs in connection with the borrowing of funds to the extent not directly related to the acquisition of qualifying assets are charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss over the tenure of the loan. Borrowing costs, allocated to and utilized for qualifying assets, pertaining to the period from commencement of activities relating to construction / development of the qualifying asset up to the date of capitalization of such asset are added to the cost of the assets. Capitalization of borrowing costs is suspended and charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss during extended periods when active development activity on the qualifying assets is interrupted.

#### 14. Segment Reporting

The company apparently has only two division of working. However, as the company is not fulfilling the criteria of AS 17 (Segment Reporting) no separate disclosure for the same is required.

# 15. Leases

Assets leased by the Company in its capacity as a lessee, where substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership vest in the Company are classified as finance leases. Such leases are capitalised at the inception of the lease at the lower of the fair value and the present value of the minimum lease payments and a liability is created for an equivalent amount. Each lease rental paid is allocated between the liability and the interest cost so as to obtain a constant periodic rate of interest on the outstanding liability for each year.

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#### 16. Earnings Per Share

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post-tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post-tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) as adjusted for dividend, interest and other charges to expense or income (net of any attributable taxes) relating to the dilutive potential equity shares, by the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share and the weighted average number of equity shares which could have been issued on the conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares. Potential equity shares are deemed to be dilutive only if their conversion to equity shares would decrease the net profit per share from continuing ordinary operations. Potential dilutive equity shares are deemed to be converted as at the beginning of the period, unless they have been issued at a later date. The dilutive potential equity shares are adjusted for the proceeds receivable had the shares been actually issued at fair value (i.e. average market value of the outstanding shares).

#### 17. Taxes on Income

#### **Current Tax**

Current tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the applicable tax rates and the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961 and other applicable tax laws.

#### **Deferred Tax**

Deferred tax is recognised on timing differences, being the differences between the taxable income and the accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are recognised for all timing differences. Deferred tax assets are recognised for timing differences of items other than unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward losses only to the extent that reasonable certainty exists that sufficient future taxable income will be available against which these can be realised. However, if there are unabsorbed depreciation and carry forward of losses and items relating to capital losses, deferred tax assets are recognised only if there is virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that there will be sufficient future taxable income available to realise the assets. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if such items relate to taxes on income levied by the same governing tax laws and the Company has a legally enforceable right for such set off. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date for their realisability.

Please refer Note # 43 for calculation of Deferred Tax

#### 18 Provisions

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions (excluding retirement benefits) are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

#### 19. Operating Cycle

Based on the nature of products / activities of the Company and the normal time between acquisition of assets and their realisation in cash or cash equivalents, the Company has determined its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of classification of its assets and liabilities as current and non-current
