

Emergency Response Procedure

Objective : These procedures are designed to ensure the safety of people and property, and to minimize the impact of the emergency on the organization's operations.

Identify the emergency:

- The first step in any emergency response procedure is to identify the nature of the emergency, its location, and the people or assets that are at risk.

Alert and notify relevant personnel:

- Once the emergency is identified, relevant personnel should be alerted and notified. This may include employees, first responders, emergency services, or other relevant parties.

Assess the situation:
